## **INTRODUCTION**

Transmission of disease in medical college settings although uncommon, has known to occur, and it is important that policies are in place to enhance the safety of the environment for all.

## **SCOPE**

This document is applicable to all workers at SULEMAN ROSHAN MEDICAL COLLEGE and HOSPITAL TANDO ADAM.

## **PURPOSE**

- To prevent and control vaccine preventable disease.
- To ensure that all workers are vaccinated.

## **Definition**

### **Immunization:**

The process whereby a person is made immune or resistant to an infectious disease, typically by the administration of a vaccine.

### **Vaccine:**

A biological preparation that improves immunity to a particular disease.

### **Policy:**

- All workers must be vaccinated for certain infectious diseases.
- All workers who are in contact with students and other staff members must be vaccinated.

### **Procedure:**

- All workers who are in contact with the students, patients shall go to the Infection Prevention & Control Department and must be screened and vaccinated against transmissible infections on the pre-employment period.
- All the health workers must be screened for the following diseases:
  - HIV
  - Hypothesis B
  - Hypothesis C
- Those workers who are working at canteens/food places/ daycare will have the following additional vaccines:

- Typhoid
- Hypothesis A
- Influenza

**Responsibility:**

- Infection, Prevention & Control Staff shall:
- Indent the needed vaccines periodically.
- Administer the vaccines to the workers.
- Maintain the record of vaccinations.
- Send the annual statistics to the Principal.
